Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Dhanvantari Ayurveda College & Hospital, Siddapur, Sirsi Road, Distt.-Uttara Kannada 581355, Karnataka, (Inst. ID AYU0087)**, inspection of your College was conducted on **08.04.2025 and 09.04.2025 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM to process the **Yearly Permission with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and Extended Permission in 02 PG course with 10 seats in the subject namely i) Kayachikitsa- 05 seats ii) Panchakarma – 05 seats, for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.**
- Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations, namely, "Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in the NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024, Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-**

3. In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the **132<sup>nd</sup> Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on **09.07.2025**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above the college was given an **opportunity of virtual hearing** vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even number** dated **25.07.2025** to appear on **28.07.2025** before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the conditional permission to your college with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 02 PG course with 10 seats in the subject namely i) Kayachikitsa- 05 seats ii) Panchakarma – 05 seats, under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2025-26.**

4. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter no. DACH/MARB/2025-26 dated 26.07.2025** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representative, **Dr.Roopa Bhat, Principal** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **28.07.2025** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college.

**I. For UG Course:-**

- Shortage of One Lecturer in the Department of Kaumarabritya:**

As per Part 1 submitted by the college, the availability of total teaching staff for the UG (BAMS) course is 97.77% (excluding excess), with a shortage of one Lecturer in the Department of Kaumarabritya. We acknowledge the observation and assure you that immediate steps are being taken to appoint a Lecturer in the said department. However, as the shortage is within the permissible 10% relaxation limit, we kindly request that this deficiency be considered for condonation.

Hearing meeting was attended by Principal - Dr.Roopa Bhat of college.

**Teaching staff**

**I. For UG Course:-**

The Principal stated that the college is having the shortage of one Assistant Professor in the department of Kaumarabritya. Principal has assured that they will fill up the post of assistant professor as early as possible. As per the observation by the visitors in Part 2, the said shortage is within the permissible 10% relaxation limit.

**1. Shortage of One Office Staff Member**

At the time of Part 1 submission, the college had four office staff. Between the submission and the visitation, one staff member, Mrs. Leena Kudalkar, resigned because of her personal reasons and was replaced .Subsequently, Mrs. Leena Kudalkar has rejoined the college on 14.05.2025. We are submitting her rejoining letter, salary payment records, and attendance register for your kind reference .However, as the shortage is within the permissible 20% relaxation limit, we kindly request that this deficiency be considered for condonation.

Principal stated that they have filled the post of Clerical staff in administration section named Mrs. Leena Kudalkar on 14.05.2025 as she had resigned earlier due to her personal reasons and again joined on the same post on 15.05.2025 which is shown in the submitted joining report. Also submitted her reappointment letter and rejoining letter, salary payment records, and attendance register to NCISM .

**1. Ambulance Facility Not Available:**

We were using vehicle No. KA31-P0267 Maruti Ortega as ambulance. Now we have already placed order for Maruti EECO Ambulance and enclosing the Quotation and Invoice for the same.

**2. Computers Not Available in Some Departments:**

Computers/laptops have been provided to all departments. During the Visitation, some laptops were under service, which may have caused the noted deficiency. Copies of the purchase invoice and service bills are enclosed herewith for verification.

1. As per the statement given by the Principal, they are using Maruti Ortega as ambulance. Also they have stated that they have placed the order for Maruti EECO ambulance and submitted the quotation & invoice for the same

**Biometric Attendance Issues**

5. Further, the observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing, AEBAS attendance was regenerated after considering the faculty. **After verification from 19.02.2025 to 20.08.2025, 25 faculties out of 51 are having very low attendance.**

6. Thereafter, the observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report along with regenerated aebas attendance report have been carefully re-examined in terms of NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, **and once again** the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the **142<sup>nd</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 21.08.2025 and Board observed that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the concerned acts and regulations but is fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letters issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025.**
7. Further, the Board also observed that the college is fulfilling the criteria for Extended Permission for 02 PG course as per Regulation 15(5) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations 2024, as the college has been permitted for last three consecutive years with intake capacity of 10 Seats in 02 PG course.
8. However, the Board decided to issue Permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28(1)(f) of NCISM Act 2020 as the college has not followed the AEBAS guidelines as mentioned in Implementation letters vide ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS and HMS dated 09.05.2024 and ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS and HMS dated 06.09.2024.

As per the Penalization Policy adopted in accordance of Section 28(1)(f) of NCISM Act 2020 for Non/Improper/Delayed Implementation of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System (AEBAS) in ASU College for the Academic year 2025-26:-

- a) "In cases of delayed or improper implementation of the Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System (AEBAS), the college shall subject to seat reduction by reducing 30% intake strength of total intake capacity."

**Therefore, for seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 30% of total intake capacity.**

9. Hence, after applying the seat reduction policy 2025-26 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020, for Non/Improper/Delayed Implementation of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System (AEBAS) in ASU Colleges for the Academic year 2025-26, the college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of Yearly permission with 70 seats [instead of 100 seats] in UG (BAMS) course as per regulation 54(3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024.

**"DECISION"**

10. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above, **Dhanvantari Ayurveda College & Hospital, Siddapur, Sirsi Road, Distt.-Uttara Kannada 581355, Karnataka, (Inst. ID AYU0087) is hereby granted with:-**
- a) **Yearly permission with seat reduction policy in UG (BAMS) course with 70 seats [instead of 100 seats] for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 54(3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024;**
- b) **Extended Permission in 02 PG course with 10 seats in subject namely i) Kayachikitsa- 05 seats ii) Panchakarma – 05 seats, for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 15(5) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulation, 2024, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.**
11. **The aforementioned decision is issued under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-**

(i) It is further informed that **minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted with 70 seats [instead of 100 seats] and minimum 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 10 Seats in 02 PG course** shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under All India Quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for All India Quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

12. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
13. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
14. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
15. **You are hereby instructed to comply with all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**
16. **The following requirements should be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach and the compliance report the Board by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
  - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
  - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
  - iii) All the requirement of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standard of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022.
  - iv) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.
  - v) The compliance of shortcoming mentioned in para- 07.
17. In case if you are not satisfied with the decision of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM, you may prefer an appeal addressed to the Chairman, NCISM, within 15 days of issuance of the letter as per Regulation 65 of MESAR 2024 and Regulation 29(5) of NCISM Act 2020.
18. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
